## VOLUNTEER REPORT

We acknowledge and celebrate this exceptional group of people who have collectively given well over 5000 hours of their time throughout the year. Jessica's House Hospice is blessed to have a team of 70+ incredible volunteers whose dedication, kindness, and tireless efforts are the heart of everything we do. Because of our volunteers, lives are being changed every day.

### **DIRECT CARE VOLUNTEERS**

This team of 40+, specially trained and caring individuals offer compassionate support and companionship to residents and families, 7 days a week.

### **IN-DIRECT VOLUNTEERS**

- Gardening, lawn & facilities maintenance team spent nearly 550 hours maintaining the incredible facility, grounds and gardens.
- The administrative team served 425 hours processing donations, issuing receipts and maintaining JHH's donor database.
- Under the leadership of Grace Winbow, our bereavement services volunteers served 28 hours facilitating group bereavement sessions.

### TASK ADVISORY TEAM

Jessica's House Hospice Task Advisory Team, served more than 1150 hours overseeing the maintenance activities, financial operations and volunteer recruitment, training and recognition activities.

### **EVENT VOLUNTEERS**

Many Jessica's House Hospice volunteers offer their time and talents and serve on committees for our signature fundraising events and represent JHH at third-party fundraising events held in the area.

### **TRAINING**

Ten new volunteers are currently completing their training, orientation and shadowing shifts and will officially join the Direct Care Volunteer Team in the coming days.

### **VOLUNTEER SURVEY**

A volunteer experience survey conducted in the summer of 2024, revealed a strong level of engagement and satisfaction within our Direct Care Volunteer Team.

### **EDUCATION SESSIONS**

Volunteer training and education sessions held throughout the year included discussions and guest speakers from the ALS Society, the Alzheimers' Society and Victim Services.

In addition, quarterly sessions were held for volunteers to come together and share their experiences with residents and families, learn about grief and the grieving process, as well as navigating difficult conversations.

### **5 YEAR VOLUNTEERS**

In the fall of 2024, 9 volunteers were formally recognized for reaching their 5 year milestone.









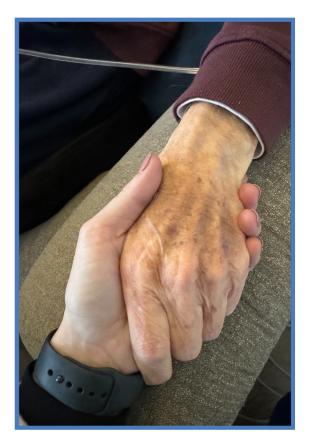


## BEREAVEMENT REPORT

**Grace Winbow: Grief and Bereavement Coordinator** 

In 2024–2025, the Jessica's House Hospice bereavement program welcomed 58 new referrals for one-on-one grief support. These referrals came from a wide range of sources across Huron County and the surrounding area, including community agencies, healthcare providers, and self-referrals.

Our bereavement program provides compassionate support through a variety of services, including individual counselling, peer support groups, and grief-related workshops. In addition to serving 58 individuals through one-on-one sessions, the program also supported 14 people through group offerings and workshops.



Throughout the year, a total of 362 hours were dedicated to one-on-one grief support for individuals navigating loss. Every new client undergoes a comprehensive intake assessment to determine the most appropriate type of support—whether individual or groupbased. These assessments explore the nature of the client's relationship with the deceased (e.g., close, complicated, or estranged) and consider the level of external support available through family, friends, or other professionals.

Jessica's House Hospice remains a trusted and valued resource in Huron County and surrounding areas, providing essential bereavement services to individuals and families during some of life's most difficult moments.

## FUNDRAISING REPORT

Meghan O'Rourke: Fund Development and Communications Coordinator

**Hike for Hospice (May 2024):** Raised a net of \$23,162 through a hybrid event, enhanced by a creative collaboration with the Lucan and Exeter libraries and Bluewater Coast Elementary School and Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic School adding a community art feature along the trail. Two past residents were featured on the trail story.

**Handbags For Hospice (October 2024):** This event was brought back after a year off. With a team of 40 volunteers success was made and Handbags for Hospice raised a net of \$90,504. The event was able to raise money to update the furniture in each of the resident rooms.

**Tribute Tree Memorial (November 2024):** Welcomed 75 attendees for a heartfelt gathering, featuring live music featuring Holly Clausius and the creation of memorial tags displayed on our Christmas trees throughout the holiday season. This event raised a net of \$4,091.

**Third-Party Fundraisers:** We had a variety of community-hosted events, with both new and returning supporters raising funds through creative initiatives. Third party events raised a total of \$66,009.

### Social Media Growth & Strategy

In 2024, we expanded our presence on Facebook and Instagram, increasing both engagement and content output. Looking ahead to 2025, we plan to incorporate LinkedIn into our strategy to build stronger connections through businesses. To boost engagement across all platforms, we aim to introduce more video content and interactive features such as interviews, Q&A comment boxes, and behind-the-scenes glimpses — leveraging the power of dynamic, shareable content.

### **Enhanced Website Experience**

We launched a new, user-friendly website in collaboration with Blue Lemon Media, providing easier navigation and a more engaging experience for visitors. Continuous updates will ensure the website reflects the ongoing growth of our programs and services.

### **Bi-Monthly Newsletters**

We started our online newsletters in summer of 2024. Each newsletter will have a story or interview, updates of events at JHH, donations, upcoming events and education. These newsletters will help increase awareness and fundraising. 2025 goal is to increase newsletters to be sent out monthly to increase awareness and share stories about JHH.

### **Mailouts**

JHH started sending out three mailouts staggered between the year. The mailouts were sent in April, September and November. These mailouts were used to increase awareness and fundraising. The November mailout was connected with the Tribute Tree Memorial Event. The Mailouts brought in a net of \$37,614.
