Maintenance Report

George Keller: Maintenance Lead, Task Advisory Team

During our last fiscal year, the maintenance group completed the final touches on the new gazebo. They added a new mural, electrical service, and stone work to the post structures.



The board has approved the installation of a new twin-boiler heating system to replace the existing system. Additionally, small electrical wall backup units will be added to each of the residents' rooms.

Our maintenance group donated approximately 830 hours to ensure the smooth operation and upkeep of our facility. We have received a very good response in recruiting new volunteers this past year to strengthen our team. We look forward to working alongside our dedicated maintenance volunteers in the coming years.

Marketing and Fundraising Report

Meghan O'Rourke: Marketing and Communications Coordinator

This summary highlights Jessica's House's achievements in 2023, focusing on building brand awareness, community engagement, and fundraising success.

Social Media Growth:

- Increased Facebook page visits by 485.87%
- Increased Instagram page visits by 395.11%
- Planned expansion to TikTok and LinkedIn for broader reach

Enhanced Website Presence:

- Launched a new, user-friendly website working with Blue Lemon Media
- Ongoing website updates will reflect future programs and services growth

Fundraising Highlights

Hike for Hospice (May 2023): Raised \$16,400 through a hybrid event, working with the local library and Precious Blood Elementary School to add a creative new feature along the local trail.

Anniversary Event (Summer 2023): Celebrated and reconnected with donors and past families.

Tribute Tree Memorial (November 2023): Gathered 75 attendees for a tribute event featuring music and creating memorial tags to display on our Christmas Trees over the holiday season.

Third-Party Events: Increased by 35% with new and returning supporters hosting successful fundraisers.

Handbags for Hospice: Did not take place in 2023

Overall, 2023 was a year of significant growth for Jessica's House. Increased social media presence, a revamped website, and successful fundraising initiatives demonstrate a strong commitment to building a supportive community and achieving fundraising goals.



Volunteer Report

Carrie Parsons: Volunteer Lead, Task Advisory Team

We finished 2023 with 25 Direct Volunteers and 37 In-Direct Volunteers.

Within the In-Direct Volunteer Team, 35 volunteers made up the Lawn, Garden and General Maintenance team; 4 volunteers made up the Bereavement Services Team; 3 of the volunteers held Team Lead positions on the Operations Committee and 4 volunteers made up the Administrative Working Team. Note: there is duplication and cross-over between the groups.

*It should be noted that on several occasions, help was provided by folks who are not on the actual volunteer registry; therefore, this time is not captured above. For example, cleaning eavestroughs, putting up Christmas lights, and extra/ongoing maintenance tasks as they arise and when JHH volunteers are not available.

The need for additional maintenance volunteers has been clearly identified. A plan is being developed to hold a targeted recruitment early in 2024 in the hopes of attracting volunteers with skilled trades and who are able to lift, climb, etc.

As work begins on Jessica's House Hospice signature fundraising events for 2024, a large number of people, with a variety of skills and interests, will need to be recruited to form working committees. Attempts will be made to accurately track these hours so as to include them in the 2024 report.











Grief and Bereavement Report

Grace Winbow: Volunteer and Grief and Bereavement Coordinator

In 2023-2024, Jessica's House Hospice bereavement program received 54 new referrals for oneon-one grief support. These referrals were received from various agencies and organizations in Huron and area, including self-referrals. JHH bereavement program offers support through diverse channels, including one-on-one support groups and bereavement-related workshops. In addition to the 54 new one-on-one clients, the bereavement program supported ten individuals through group support and workshops. In 2023-2024, 255 hours were dedicated to providing oneon-one support to individuals in the community who are grieving. Breaking down this figure, 27 hours were spent with individuals between the ages of 0-18, 124 hours were spent with individuals aged 19-64, and 104 hours were spent with individuals aged 65 and up. The numbers above demonstrate that the JHH bereavement program supports a wide demographic range. Assessment tools for new clients encompass various aspects, including an intake assessment to determine if they are appropriate for group support or one-on-one support, identifying what the relationship was like to the deceased (i.e. Complex, close, no relationship), determine the level of support being received outside of JHH (i.e. Other professionals, friends, family, etc.). The bereavement services offered at Jessica's House Hospice continue to be a well-utilized and respected resource in the Huron community and surrounding areas.
